Among our many initiatives are those that center on education and leadership training. Perhaps you don't know that AAUW is one of the world's largest sources of funding for graduate women. For the 2016-17 academic year, AAUW is providing over \$3.7 million in funding for more than 230 fellowships and grants to outstanding women and nonprofit organizations.

Through Tech Trek and related initiatives we are leveling the playing field for girls and women in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. At this time we are interviewing the girls who will attend this year's Tech Trek camp.

#### AAUW CA Election for 2017-2018

This Spring of 2017 AAUW CA members will be voting for positions on the AAUW CA Board of Directors. Our bylaws limit the AAUW CA Board of Directors to twelve members, including President Elect, Chief Financial Officer (CFO) and Directors (at large). In 2017, we are voting to fill four positions. If Co-Presidents Elect are elected, then the remaining vacancies consist of CFO and one Director.

The AAUW CA voting period will begin on April 22 and will close on May 12, 2017. The election will be run by *Vote Now*. Every member has the opportunity to vote electronically or with paper ballots if they prefer.

When the election period starts, each member will receive an email message containing an invitation to vote. There will be a link to click that will take you to the ballot. No password or code needs to be entered. Voting can be done on computers, tablets or smart phones. Members who do not have an address will be mailed information about requesting a paper ballot. If you need to vote by mail, please allow enough time to request & return your ballot.
