Co-Presidents' Message

We can never repeat AAUW's mission - to Advance Gender Equity for Women and Girls Through Research, Education and Advocacy - too many times. While many of our members enjoy friendships made through participation in the Branch's interest group activities, it is our mission that is our core.

This year AAUW has launched a new strategic plan, Beyond Aspirations: Advancing Equity for Women and Girls, towards achieving that mission. One of the most exciting goals in the plan is to achieve pay equity by 2030. New York Times author A. C. Shilton article entitled How to Be an Ace Salary Negotiator (Even if You Hate College) recently gave a shout out to AAUW's online Salary Skill Builder Workshop. AAUW's website offers tools to help women create their own script for salary negotiations.

When explaining our group to potential new members, rather than simply reciting what the initials "AAUW" stand for, try adding, "our purpose is to achieve gender equity for women and girls." The conversation should evolve into an explanation of how our branch is trying to achieve gender equity including participation in Tech Trek, review of applicants for our San Mateo Community College District and NCCWSL scholarships, branch programs, and contributions for fellowships and grants.

In the next few months three programs highlight AAUW's mission - the Tech Trek brunch, AAUW Funds Luncheon and Ballot Measures Pros and Cons Presentation (joint meeting with the League of Women Voters.) Please try to attend all events.

AAUW Interest Sections

Are you a new member considering one of our interest sections or a seasoned member ready for something new? To encourage you to join a new group, each month Bay Leaves will be featuring an interest section starting this month with Boggle.

BOGGLE (3rd Wednesday at 1:30-3:30)

We play "Big" Boggle, a popular word game with 25, 6-sided letter cubes that are mixed up by shaking the box in which they are held. Players (usually 4-5 per table) then try to spot and write down as many words as they can find by mixing/matching adjoining letters within a specified amount of time - we use 5 minutes. Once time runs out, each player reads out their words to the others. Any words also written by another player, are marked out and the remaining words counted as unique. The player with the highest number of unique words is the "winner" of that hand. It's great fun and good exercise for the mind. If you would like to join us, please contact Judy Steele.
