Several of our members attended the Fund fall luncheon at the Basque Cultural Center honoring five 2019-2020 California Fellowship and Grant Recipients. Cathy Foxhoven, State Co-President; Diane Owens, Chairperson of the AAUW Funds Committee and State President-Elect; and Heather Miller, Advancement Director, welcomed the guests and summarized AAUW's vision for the future including the five-star program and the state convention on April 17-19 at the Westin San Francisco Airport in Millbrae.

The program moved along quickly with each recipient being introduced by a hostess, an AAUW member who learned about the recipient's background and facilitated table conversation with the recipient during lunch. Our own Betty Bernstein introduced American Fellow Christina Azahar Folger, a daughter of El Savador immigrants, on her path to obtain a Ph.D in Ethnomusicology at UC Berkeley. This year AAUW is awarding \$4 million dollars in fellowships and grants to 259 women and community projects serving women and girls with 36 recipients studying in California colleges and universities or doing projects in our communities.

Aisula Aitbekova, an international fellowship recipient from Kazakhstan now studying for a Ph.D in Chemical Engineering at Stanford, said the fellowship gave her stability and freedom. She also noted that the AAUW members at her table seemed close and observed how fortunate our membership is to have a camaraderie as well as a purpose. It is important to remember AAUW's mission of advancing gender equity for women and girls as we enjoy our Branch's interest groups. We can support that mission by donating to greatest needs or strategic plan focus areas, participating and attending mission related programs, volunteering to serve on the Board or providing much needed social media assistance.
