Presidents' Message

As part of our Co-President duties for AAUW, this year we are acting as chairpersons for our local IBC -Interbranch Council--which includes the nearby branches of Half Moon Bay, Mid-Peninsula, North Peninsula, Pacifica, and San Francisco. As Co-Presidents, we notify other IBC branches of quarterly and specific group meetings and attend those meetings.

Judy recently attended a special lunch meeting at which Kim Churches, National CEO, spoke. Kim is widely recognized for her success at working collaboratively in education as well as on capacitybuilding among grassroots groups and national and international nonprofits. She also serves on the Board of the Leadership Conference on Civil & Human Rights and is a member of the International Women's Forum of Washington, D.C., and the Association of Fundraising Professionals.

With her pragmatic approach, Kim is a dynamic and popular speaker, emphasizing AAUW's strategic vision which concentrates on the three critical areas where we can make the biggest difference in gender equity: education and training, economic security, and leadership. She emphasized that AAUW is working hard to make us "distinct and differentiated" from other women's advocacy groups by focusing specifically on mission impact.

Kim reminded us of the recently developed on-line *Work Smart Program*, for which National received a \$500,000 grant from Coca-Cola to train 100,000 women in salary negotiations by August 31, 2019. As of the luncheon date (Aug. 22^{nd}), they had already achieved 90,000 which could mean more funders looking to AAUW for mission impact.

Kim also spoke about all of our on-going struggles to recruit new and younger AAUW members. National is trying some new models/ideas including a new Equity Network to be tested this fall, that will complement AAUW, but be for donations rather than memberships. She noted that younger women are more interested in social media groups with gender equity emphasis rather than "joining their mother's or grandmother's" clubs.

Kim Churches also spoke of a related topic, AAUW National fund-raising model, which currently has "extraordinary resources" in restricted endowments (they give out more than \$4 million/year to fund women's educational futures!). However, they desperately need more in their much smaller unrestricted funds "to support their strategic plan priorities" - i.e. to be able to respond in a more timely manner to relevant and newsworthy equity issues (such as the many recent workplace sexual harassment reports). In that regard, National will soon be launching a new "5 Star Recognition Program" which will have 5 major focus areas: Advancement, Communications & External Relations, Programs, Public Policy & Research, and Governance & Stability". National feels that with all levels of AAUW working together on these common goals that focus on mission, new membership will follow.
