#### **Equal Pay Day - Making Progress**

Good news! *Equal Pay Day* is two days earlier than it was last year. We're making progress but very slowly. Most women will have to work until March 31, 2020, to earn as much as the typical man earned by December 31, 2019. In other words, a woman has to work 15 months to be paid what a man is paid in 12 months.

Last year on Equal Pay Day (April 2, 2019) several of our members joined the Mid-Peninsula Branch in handing out bookmarks to commuters coming home from work at local Cal Trans stations. We handed out bookmarks attached to cookies (baked by our members) with a bite taken out to represent the pay gap between men and women. This year the Board decided the equal pay disparity message could better be distributed at libraries rather than train stations. We have joined the Mid-Peninsula Branch in purchasing the bookmarks and will take them to local libraries to be available to readers.

Women working full time are paid, on average, 80 cents for every dollar paid to a man. The gender pay gap exists across all demographics, in every part of the country, and in nearly every line of work. AAUW is working to close that gap through education, research and advocacy. Its efforts are paying off; for the second year in a row the Coca-Cola Foundation has awarded \$500,000.00 to AAUW to support its Women's Empowerment Program. Last year the grant enabled the development of an online version of the *Work Smart* salary negotiation course. This year the training will be focused on college and university students especially historically black colleges and universities. AAUW is helping to close the gap. Pass the word.

#### The Electoral College

Contrary to popular belief, the Electoral College is not an institution of higher learning. It is, instead, how the United States actually elects its president and vice-president. The concept of the Electoral College has been a part of the United States electoral system since the ratification of the Constitution because the writers of the Constitution did not trust the citizens to elect a president directly. In recent years, because of the Electoral College system, two men were elected president even though they lost the popular vote-George W. Bush and Donald Trump.

#### **AAUW Members View Just Mercy**

For Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, seven members of the Movie Group and Book Group III attended a showing of *Just Mercy* at the downtown San Mateo theater. Book group III last week discussed the non-fiction book that was the basis of the movie. *Just Mercy* is about Bryan Stevenson, a black civil rights lawyer in the deep south who has argued and won a number of cases before the U.S. Supreme Court, including a 2019 ruling protecting condemned prisoners who suffer from dementia and a landmark 2012 ruling that banned mandatory life imprisonment without parole sentences for all children 17 or younger.

Stevenson is also founder and Executive Director of the Equal Justice Initiative (EJI), a human rights organization in Montgomery, Alabama. EJI has won major legal challenges eliminating excessive and unfair sentencing, exonerating innocent death row prisoners, confronting abuse of the incarcerated and the mentally ill, and aiding children prosecuted as adults. In addition, Stevenson has initiated major new anti-poverty and anti-discrimination efforts that challenge inequality in America.

Stevenson led the creation of two highly acclaimed cultural sites which opened in 2018: the *Legacy Museum* and the *National Memorial for Peace and Justice*. These new national landmark institutions chronicle the legacy of slavery, lynching, and racial segregation, and the connection to mass incarceration and current issues of racial bias.
