Join us on Saturday, March 11, at 2:00 pm at the Redwood Shores Public Library, 399 Marine Pwky, Redwood City, for a presentation by the new San Mateo County Sheriff, Christina Corpus.

Sheriff Corpus began with the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office as a Correctional Officer in 2002 and worked her way up to Captain/Chief of Police before being sworn in as the 26<sup>th</sup> Sheriff of San Mateo County in January 2023.

Throughout her career, she has served in the Corrections Division, Professional Standards, and Operations Division. Sheriff Corpus has developed the first Women in Law Enforcement Boot Camp and Symposium to increase workforce diversity to mentor and train women seeking a career in law enforcement.

Her professional accomplishments include a BS in criminal justice and a MS in law enforcement and public safety leadership. Sheriff Corpus is the first female sheriff in San Mateo County since the founding of the San Mateo County sheriff's office in 1856. She is also one of the first Latina sheriffs in California. # AAUW Fellow, Preethi Fernando, to Speak at IBC Meeting

Join us for a wonderful presentation by AAUW Fellow, Preethi Fernando, about her book, 17 Women Who Shook the World. Learn more about Shirley Chisolm, Harriet Tubman, Esther Morris, Meryl Streep, and many more. Discover some the behavior and thinking patterns that attract success and happiness.

Preethi inspires women, men, and children to achieve their dreams, find success, and lead meaningful lives. She was the winner of Stephen King's *Haven Foundation Award*, given to an author each year and the *Carnegie Fund for Authors*.

Originally from Sri Lanka, Preethi now calls Colorado her home. In addition to her writing, Preethi does humanitarian work in Sri Lanka to improve the lives of underprivileged women and children. ### March is Women's History Month

Women's History Month generally honors women of the past for their contributions to society and their fights for equality. However, there are strong women who are <u>currently</u> achieving amazing feats while breaking through tough barriers. One of these amazing women is Monica Bertagnolli. Her strengths in the sciences and her struggles to achieve recognition and equality in the field of medicine are truly remarkable.

Monica was born, raised and educated in Rock Springs, WY, population 23,000. She excelled in academics and became a Presidential Scholar. Monica was admitted to Princeton University at a time when very few women were involved in the sciences. She received a BS in engineering from Princeton. Relentless in her studies, she chose medicine and graduated from the University of Utah Medical School. Monica continued to excel in her studies and chose to pursue her oncological surgery residency at Harvard University Medical School.

Dr. Bertagnolli was hired to work as a teaching professor in Harvard's Medical School at a time when Dr. Lawrence H. Summers was the president of the University. He was dismissed from Harvard when he stated that "women might lack an intrinsic aptitude for math and science." At that time, Monica was the only woman in her department and the only one who had not been promoted. In spite of Dr. Summers statement, she persisted. Many things changed once Dr. Summers was dismissed from Harvard for his erroneous comments.

Dr. Bertagnolli is now a Professor of Surgery at Harvard University Medical School, and an Associate Surgeon at Dan Faber Cancer Institute and Brigham and Women's Hospital. Most recently, she was appointed as the 16<sup>th</sup> director of the National Cancer Institute (NCI) on October 3, 2022

Dr. Monica Bertagnolli has proven that women DO have the intrinsic aptitude for the math and sciences. This is a special story for us because Monica is the niece of Cathy Foxhoven, a former member of our branch and the AAUW CA Co-President Elect!

### AAUW-SF Silver Jubilee Scholarship

The AAUW-SF Silver Jubilee Scholarship Fund will offer scholarships of \$3,000 to help women in their final two years of undergraduate school or graduate program at an accredited college or university for the 2023-24 fall and spring semesters. Scholarship candidates may have a San Francisco address and/or attend a school within 100 miles of San Francisco. There are no restrictions on the use of the funds.
