Step up for Pro-Choice webinar

Join AAUW Silicon Valley and the Santa Clara County Pro-Choice Community for a virtual event marking the 51st anniversary of *Roe v Wade* on January 22.

The speaker will be Dr. Christine Henneberg, a practicing physician and author. She earned her MD/MS in Health Sciences from the UC Berkeley--UCSF Joint Medical Program. Dr. Henneberg will discuss the "side effects" of the Dobbs decision and how it has played out politically this year. What can pro-choice groups advocate for in 2024? Grassroots Climate Change

Tech Trek

We also need volunteers to be involved at the camp: a co director, a few dorm moms who tend to 10 or 12 campers at the dorm, and other volunteers to help with the credit union budgeting program at the Santa Clara site (week of July 7^{th}).

AAUW CA Lobby Days 2024

AAUW Bylaws Change 2024

We have been notified that many members did not receive an important email from AAUW National regarding a proposed bylaws change to allow open membership.

The National AAUW Board of Directors and Governance Committee recommend approval of the following bylaw amendment to eliminate the degree requirement for membership in AAUW. This change will align our membership practices with our purpose of advancing equity for women and girls and enable us to include members with the diverse backgrounds and perspectives needed to achieve our purpose in today's world.

AAUW's name, which continues to have significant brand recognition for AAUW as a women's rights organization, will remain the same if the amendment is adopted.

Summary of the Proposed Revision of Article III:

- Replace the Individual Members paragraph of the Membership Qualification provision (currently Article III Section 2 a) with new language indicating the sole requirement for membership is support of AAUW's purpose.
- Delete the provision on Student Associates (currently Section 3) since students would be allowed to join as full members of AAUW thus eliminating the need for a Student Associate provision.

There are other revisions to this amendment that are mainly for clarification. Please consider this bylaw change carefully, it could affect the future of AAUW.
