## January General Meeting

January is *National Human Trafficking Prevention Month*. Our January general meeting will be a discussion by a panel of experts on human trafficking. This will be a joint meeting with the Mid-Peninsula Branch, Saturday, January 10, at 1:30 pm, at Skyway Center, 655 Skyway Road, San Carlos.

Human trafficking isn't always sex trafficking, it can also be forced labor, so anyone may be the victim of this terrible practice. According to the Alliance to End Human Trafficking, large sporting events like the Super Bowl and World Cup can be accompanied by possible human trafficking due to the increased demand for labor and commercial sex services.

Three huge sporting events are coming to the Bay Area in 2026, beginning with Super Bowl LX at Levi Stadium in February; *March Madness* follows at San Jose State University; then, in the summer, the World Cup will also be held at Levi Stadium. Since these types of giant sporting events are believed to boost human trafficking, all agencies have been strategizing on how to handle increased operations.

Three experts will be on the panel. San Mateo County Sheriff's Office incoming Assistant Sheriff, Ryan Monaghan, is one of the panelists. Monaghan has been heading up San Mateo County's *Human Trafficking Prevention and Enforcement Initiative* and will bring a huge knowledge base to the conversation. Also on the panel is Elizabeth Quiroz, M.A., a Doctoral Student (EdD) and Co-Founder of Redemption House of The Bay Area. She is a survivor of human sex trafficking and author of *Purified in The Flame*, in which she relays her experience. The third speaker is Lisa Blanchard, the Founder and Executive Director of Grateful Garment Project in San Jose. They provide clothing and necessities for sexual assault victims who must give up their clothing when they undergo a medical exam. Human trafficking is a huge problem in San Mateo County. Please join us for this informative meeting and to find out how we can all help.

## Public Policy

The January Public Policy meeting will be a Webinar entitled *Title IX: Its History and the Use and Abuse of Title IX*. The Webinar's mission is to explore the historical evolution, current landscape, and future implications of Title IX, with a focus on its impact on gender equity in education, athletics, and beyond. ## Interest Sections Introductions

**Boggle:** This group plays "Big" Boggle, a word game with 25 six-sided letter cubes that are mixed up by shaking the box in which they are held. Players try to spot and write down as many words they can find by mixing/matching adjoining letters within a specified amount of time. Once time runs out, each player reads out their words. Any words also written by another player are marked out and the remaining words counted as unique. The player with the highest number of unique words is the winner. It's great fun and good exercise for the mind.

Boggle is held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the month from 1:30 to 2:30 pm, year round, at a member's home. Judy Steele is the group leader.

**Mah Jongg:** This section plays a simplified Chinese form of Mah Jongg. Mah Jongg is a "rummy" like game, but played with tiles instead of cards. It's typically played by four players, at each table, who each receives 13 tiles. The core objective is to be the first player to build a complete legal hand by drawing and discarding tiles. New members will be given instructions on how to play. This is a fun afternoon that isn't too competitive!

Mah Jongg is held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday at the home of Helen Hatchett and the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday at the home of Maureen Buchner, from 1:00 to 3:30 pm. Helen Hatchett is the group leader.
